

GASOLINE SAFETY

- Never use or store around an open flame, pilot lights, portable heaters or other ignition sources!
- Never smoke or permit smoking where being dispensed or stored!
- Never use to start, restart or accelerate a fire!
- Never refill gasoline engines when hot!
- Never use as a hand cleaner!
- Never use as a solvent to clean things!
- Always store in proper safety cans that are rated for gasoline!
- Never store in glass or plastic bottle containers!
- Dispense in a well ventilated area!
- Remove clothing that has been soaked by gasoline!
- Limit the amount in the workplace!



1 gallon of gasoline = 20 sticks of dynamite!
An ignited gasoline fireball can reach
temperatures of 15,000 degrees F.
